

## **Translation – English Version**

Attorney: How old are you?

Ryam: 21

Attorney: You're still very young, are you still a bachelor? How many girlfriends?

Anna: He has no girlfriend sir.

Attorney: What's the highest educational attainment did you have?

Anna: He only finished 5<sup>th</sup> grade in elementary sir.

Attorney: Do you have a job?

Ryam: I'm a motor driver

Attorney: What kind of motor? Single? Or motorela?

Ryam: Pump Boat

Attorney: Oh, motorized sikad is what you mean. How many siblings in the family?

Anna: 4 sir.

Attorney: What's your ordinal position in the family?

Anna: He's our youngest sir.

Attorney: Whos the next sibling after him?

Anna: That would be me sir.

Attorney: How old are you?

Anna: I'm 26 sir.

Attorney: After you, whos the next in line?

Anna: The next one is 28 and then 29 years old.

Attorney: Are your parents still alive?

Anna: We don't have a father anymore.

Attorney: When did he die and what's the cause?

Anna: He died of a "High Blood Attack" on 2004

Attorney: How old was he when he died?

Anna: 58 sir.

Attorney: Missis, how old are you right now?

Mother: 56

Attorney: So youre younger than him. Is this your daughter?

Mother: Yes sir.

Attorney: Whats your family name right now?

Anna: Mabao sir.

Attorney: That's from Valencia bukidnon right?

Anna: Yes sir.

Attorney: Missis, do you have any plans of re marrying after your husband died?

Mother: No sir, im already old.

Attorney: So, is Castillion your neighbor?

Mother: Yes, but he's far away since hes living in the subdivision and we live in zone 3 near barangay hall.

Attorney: So, lets start. Are the three of you living in the same house?

Mother: Yes sir.

Attorney: Is that your house?

Mother: Its like a duplex sir but my husband owns the house and when we got married, I joined to live their house with my mother and my siblings.

Attorney: This is in Barra Opol right? And this is not part of the subdivision and you live in "Kalye Lahutay".

Anna: Yes sir, correct.

Attorney: The house of Castillion is not on the same street as you are right? And he lives in the main road. Is that correct?

Anna: Yes Sir.

Attorney: On the way to your home, do you pass by Castillion's house?

Sister: No sir because it's a very far from our house and you have to ride a sikad to reach there.

Attorney: The incident happened June 10 at 8pm right? Where did it happen?

Anna: Yes, correct. It happened at the back of Castillion's house.

Attorney: Before the incident happened, do you know Castillion personally?

Anna: No sir, we didn't know who he was and that he was a policeman. When the incident happened, we went to have the case blotted and that's when we knew who he was.

Attorney: How did the incident happen?

Ryam: At first, I was doing my rounds as a driver when I felt that my stomach was a bit irritated and I felt the need to defecate and that's when I passed their residence, I decided to defecate near the "parrel" and that's when I heard somebody screaming "there's someone at the back of our house!" and that was Castillion's wife.

Attorney: At this point, did you have your pants down already?

Ryam: Yes sir but I wasn't able to continue to defecate because that was when I was distracted by the screaming lady.

Attorney: So you were at the back of their house, your pants are down already but you weren't able to defecate because you heard the lady scream. Is that correct?

Ryam: Yes sir that's what happened.

Attorney: Ok, continue.

Ryam: That was when I went out of the "parrel" and Castillion approached me near their gate beside the road.

Attorney: So this approach happened on the road side where people could see very well what was going on. Right?

Ryam: Yes sir.

Attorney: Ok, you can continue.

Ryam: When he approached me, he commanded me "Don't Run!" and I told him "No sir, I have no intention of running" and I stood steadily while he was nearing towards me. "What did I do wrong sir?" I asked.

Attorney: So, he approached you while he was talking and was he holding his hand gun with him?

Ryam: Yes sir, at this time, he was holding his handgun down to the ground and when he was very near me, he told me "You were peeping at my wife!" and I told him, "No sir, I did not peep"

Attorney: Where was he holding his handgun, was it the left or right hand? And when he approached you, did he point the gun at you immediately?

Ryam: He was holding it on his right hand sir and yes he held the gun on me.

Attorney: What happened when he approached you?

Ryam: He told me again "You were peeping on my wife!" and I told him again that I did not.

Attorney: And what happened next?

Ryam: He punched me sir.

Attorney: Ok, he used his left hand when he punched you, right? Because if he used his right hand, he wouldn't be able to punch but just to hit you using the handgun

Ryam: Yes sir, that's correct.

Attorney: So he punched you with his left hand, where did he hit you?

Ryam: On my chest sir.

Attorney: What happened after he punched you?

Ryam: I was out of breath for a couple of seconds sir. I was gasping for air heavily.

Attorney: What happened after this?

Ryam: I was trying to explain while gasping for air that I wasn't peeping but he wouldn't listen and he told me "we don't have to talk about anything" and he punched me again with his left hand.

Attorney: Where did he hit you this time?

Ryam: I was hit on the abdominal area this time sir.

Attorney: Did you fall over?

Ryam: No sir but I was holding my stomach and was assuming an arched position.

Attorney: So he hit you the second time with his left hand on the abdominal area and what happened next?

Ryam: He told me in a commanding voice "Kneel! Now!" and so I obeyed and kneeled

Attorney: So you were kneeling, at this time, did people see this happen?

Ryam: Yes sir, there were a lot of people who saw the incident.

Attorney: Ok, so when you kneeled, what happened next?

Ryam: He got his gun out and pointed it at me.

Attorney: What hand did he use? Specifically, where did he point the barrel at?

Ryam: He used both hands and pointed the gun on my forehead.

Attorney: Ok, what happened next? What were you saying at this point in time?

Ryam: I repeatedly asked for an apology and told him "Sir, I don't know what I did wrong but im sorry sir" but he didn't listen to anything I was saying and in return he kicked me.

Attorney: What was he saying at this time?

Ryam: He repeatedly said that I was peeping but I insisted I did not and he kicked me again the second time.

Attorney: Which leg did he use to kick you? And where were you hit?

Ryam: He used his left leg sir and he hit my chest sir.

Attorney: Did you fall down this time?

Ryam: I fell down this time sir and landed on my back on the ground and I got up.

Attorney: When you got up did you stand up or did you kneel? What happened next?

Ryam: I still kneeled sir and this was the time my companion who's a motorized sikad driver came to pass and Castillion asked him "Do you know this guy?" my fellow driver said "Yes, hes one of us sir, he's also a motorized sikad driver"

Attorney: After this, what happened?

Ryam: He told me to get up sir.

Attorney: Did he force you to get up or did he pull your collar or something?

Ryam: He just commanded me to get up sir.

Attorney: When you got up, what happened? Did you just stand or did you walk away?

R: He grabbed my shirt and he forced me to get into another motorized sikad different from whom he asked previously.

Attorney: What was the driver's name? Can you recall?

Ryam: His name is "Migo" sir.

Attorney: What was the name of the first driver whom Castillion asked?

Ryam: He is Cagas sir.

Attorney: What happened after this?

Ryam: He pushed me to the motorized sikad sir.

Attorney: Was he still holding his gun at this point?

Ryam: Yes sir but I couldn't see it. Maybe he put it in his pocket.

Attorney: What did Castillion say to the driver named "migo"?

Ryam: Nothing. But he told me he would bring me to the OUTPOST.

Attorney: What did you say after he told you this?

Ryam: I said "its ok with me sir if youll bring me to the outpost."

Attorney: That's a good answer. Continue

Ryam: He accompanied me to the motorized sikad sir. We were both on the sikad of migo and this was 8pm.

Attorney: Were there people who followed you to the outpost? How far was the outpost from the incident?

Ryam: No sir, no one followed. I think it was 15mins sikad ride.

Attorney: While migo was driving and he was holding his gun, what did Castillion say to you?

Ryam: Castillion asked me again why I peeped his wife but I again insisted I did not and told him I was only trying to defecate. He then asked me who was with me that time and I told him I was alone. After this, he hit his gun on my chest because I did not admit I was peeping.

Attorney: How many times did he hit you? Were there any bruises?

Ryam: Only once while we were on the sikad. And no there were no bruises.

Attorney: What happened during this span of time that you were on the sikad on the way to the outpost?

Ryam: I asked for forgiveness because I was defecating in his property sir. I did this to make him stop from hitting me.

Attorney: When you arrived at the outpost, what did you do?

Ryam: He got off the sikad first and he grabbed me and he kicked me again on the abdominal area while "Migo" was watching. He still used his left leg and when I got hit, I bumped into the door of the outpost. After this, he grabbed me again and forced me into the outpost.

Attorney: After this what happened?

Ryam: He told me to sit in the chair near the table where the on duty police officer was.

Attorney: Was the policeman a barangay police or a uniformed police? What did the police man say?

Ryam: The policeman was a regular uniformed policeman. He asked what was the case about and Castillion told him I was peeping to his wife and the policeman went on to investigate and blotter the case.

Attorney: Can you remember the police man's name?

Ryam: No sir but I can recognize his face.

Attorney: How long did the policeman investigate you?

Ryam: it lasted for about 15 minutes sir.

Attorney: After this, what happened?

Ryam: After the investigation was over, Castillion told me to take off my shirt.

Attorney: Wait, what were you wearing? A shirt? Shorts and Slippers?

Ryam: Yes sir, just like what im wearing right now.

Attorney: Ok, continue.

Ryam: I took off my shirt first sir and he told me to turn around once and he said out loud that I had no bruises around my body.

Attorney: After he told you this, what did you do?

Ryam: I said nothing sir. I just kept silent and bowed my head low. After this, Castillion let me choose between going to jail, being hit with something (Bunal) or to cultivate/clean the soil as a punishment.

Attorney: So Castillion let you choose between the three. What did you choose?

Ryam: I chose to cultivate soil sir.

Attorney: Did he ever tell you where and when you will cultivate? What did Castillion say after you chose to cultivate soil?

Ryam: Castillion told me that it was my choice to cultivate soil and he left. I cultivated soil right then and there.

Attorney: What did you use to cultivate the soil? Who gave you the tool? What time did this happen?

Ryam: I used a knife sir the police officer handed to me and this happened at around 9:00-9:30pm already.

Attorney: Was Castillion still around the area? What time were you released?

Ryam: No sir, Castillion already left the area and I was released around 10pm.

Attorney: Tell me about the work you did, the tool you used and how you used it.

Ryam: I cultivated the soil at the outpost taking grasses off and cleaned the area thoroughly. I was using a knife but it was not stainless, it was old.

Attorney: Like the ones used when killing a pig?

Ryam: Yes sir, like that.

Attorney: How did you end cultivating the soil, did you tell them you would stop or did the officers tell you to stop?

Ryam: The same officer told me to stop and I asked him if I can leave and he told me I can so I was glad about this.

Attorney: Ok, let me ask you, did you sign anything at the outpost?

Ryam: I signed a document before I decided to cultivated soil sir.

Attorney: Did you sign before you were asked to remove your shirt? Did you sign before the knife was handed to you?

Ryam: I was asked to sign a document in front of castillion before I got the knife, before I took my shirt off and before I decided to cultivate the soil.

Attorney: Do you have a copy of the signed document?

Ryam: No sir but I saw Castillion sign something.

Attorney: Ok, let me see your signature as they are in the police document. Sign here (Attorney hands a piece of scratch paper)

Ryam: (ryam signs)

Attorney: Where did you sign? Into a paper? Or a Log book?

Ryam: Silent

Attorney: (Asks ann) Do you have a document that you have from the police station?

Ann: No sir. We did not receive anything.

Attorney: Ok, don't worry. Maybe there's some other document signed. Im just trying to make him recall the events from the outpost and maybe he just forgot to take a signed document from the outpost. Im just trying to see the factual events here so I can help you out because in a case like this, its more likely that he cannot remember everything including signed documents and it might be very important in the future.

Attorney: So its clear that this is whats happening: Ryam and Castillion signed something but Ryam just don't remember what it was.

Attorney: So going back, after the officer told you you can go, did you go straight to your house?

Ryam: Yes sir, I went straight home.

Attorney: So when you were assaulted the first time, did people see you?

Ryam: Yes sir, some of my fellow drivers saw it.

Attorney: Ok, when you were about to enter the outpost and he hit you again, did people see it?

Ryam: The barangay tanods saw it sir.

Attorney: When you were investigated, were there any fellow drivers who entered the outpost?

Ryam: No sir.

Attorney: When you were cultivating in the outpost, did people see you?

Ryam: Yes, my fellow drivers and some neighbors passing by saw me.

Attorney: Did you return the dirty knife after you were done with the cultivating?

Ryam: Yes sir.

Attorney: When you went out of the outpost, did people see you?

Ryam: No sir.

Attorney: In going home, did you ride a sikad or just walked?

Ryam: I walked home sir.

Attorney: Who was at home when you arrived?

Ryam: My sisters sir. My mother wasn't at home.

Attorney: (asks ann) When did you find out about this incident?

Ann: It wasn't until the next morning when I knew about this incident because he did not tell any of us.

Ryam: I went to sleep when I got home from the incident sir. I was very afraid, and thought I can let it pass for that night.

Attorney: (asking ann) How did you find out about this incident?

Ann: We noticed he could not get up from bed the next morning and that was when he told us everything.

Attorney: How many days was he not able to get up from bed?

Ryam: Only one day sir.

Attorney: So the day after the incident happened, you weren't able to go to work. Correct?

Ryam: Yes sir.

Attorney: Ok, so let me ask you, when you went off your motorized sikad to defecate, where did you leave your sikad?

Ryam: I left it a couple of meters from the residence of Castillion but my older brother fetched it after I told him to.

Attorney: When your older brother got home from fetching the sikad, were you still awake?

Ryam: No sir, I was already asleep.

Attorney: What time were you able to get home?

Ryam: I went home at around 10:30pm.

Attorney: Are you living in the same house? Was he not alarmed why you left the sikad far from your house?

Ryam: I told him there's a problem and that I needed him to fetch the sikad for me and he went on. He asked me about the problem but I didn't tell him until the next day.

Attorney: Ok, well enough. Let me ask you, when was the first time you saw Castillion after the June 10 incident?

Ryam: We saw each other on the 15<sup>th</sup> when he went to the house and he was mad because I filed a case against him the day after the incident happened, that was on the 11th.

Attorney: Where did you file the case?

Ann: I accompanied him to Opol and not on the same outpost sir and we filed the case there with me spearheading, which was on the 11th.

Attorney: How did he know you filed a case against him?

Ann: There was another sikad driver that told Castillion about it.

Ann: On the 12<sup>th</sup>, we were at the barangay hall to file the case formally because it took us too long to get his medical certificate on the 11th.

Attorney: Ok, so the next day after the incident, you filed a case at Opol and then the next day, to the barangay. On the next two days, there was nothing significant that happened and on the 15<sup>th</sup>, he went to your house because he's mad about the case you filed against him. Is this correct?

Ann: Yes sir

Attorney: (to ryam) Where were you when he went to your house?

Ryam: I was on my neighbor's house sir.

Attorney: Who was at home when he went to your house?

Ann: I was there sir.

Attorney: What did he do when he was at your house?

Ann: He looked for ryam and I told him he was at our neighbor's because I was very scared when he was at our house. So he went to our neighbor's house.

Attorney: Ryam, what was the first thing he said and did when he saw you?

Ryam: He grabbed me and asked why I filed a case against him and that he insisted I was the perpetrator. He then pulled his gun, cocked it and punched me with his left hand in front of a lot of people including our neighbors. When he pointed the gun at me, I ran around and hid under the seated people who were playing cards at that time in my neighbors house. He went after me and again asked the same question and I told them that we can just settle the case at the barangay hall and I immediately asked for forgiveness just to protect myself because at that point, I thought it's the best that I can do to avoid getting shot. He was very ruthless and he was screaming at our neighbors and repeatedly saying "Wala kayong pakialam!" (this has nothing to do with you, let me do what I want to) in front of the people who were also scared because he was hoisting his gun around.

Attorney: (asking ann) Where were you when this happened?

Ann: Someone from the neighbors house informed me right after ryam was punched by Castillion and so I ran as fast as I could and saw castillion going out from our neighbors

house and I told him to settle the dispute at the barangay hall. I was very scared I didn't even come close to him and that was when he screamed to everyone "Walang Makikialam!" (Do not interfere!). After this happened, everyone was scared and he again screamed and warned everyone saying "Babalikan ko kayo!" (I will be back to get you!) And then he rode a sikad and went home. That's when I got ryan and we locked ourselves at our house and tried to contact who ever could help us.

Attorney: Did you ever get the chance to talk to him again at the barangay hall?

Ann: Yes sir, the next day because we went to the Opol barangay hall at around 10am to blotter the case but we were surprised to find out that he was there before us to report the case to the chief police officer named "Jumalon".

Attorney: Was he in uniform? What did you do? Whos with you?

Ann: Yes, humalon was in uniform. I was their, my aunt and my mom. My aunt was the only one who talked to Jumalon and Castillion.

Attorney: Did Jumalon interview you about the incident?

Ann: Yes, we were investigated together with Castillion and Jumalon was questioning both parties.

Attorney: Did Castillion tell the truth?

Ann: Yes sir and he then he asked for forgiveness from me and told me to forgive him because he only did it because he was controlled by his temper rather than his conscious mind.

Attorney: What did you tell him?

Ann: I told him "No sir, WE cannot forgive you because what you did to our younger sibling was too much" It would have been ok if we settled it for the first time but this time after you went to our house and insulted us infront of everyone, Its just to much.

Attorney: Were you able to blotter the case at the police station?

Ann: Yes sir.

Attorney: What about Castillion?

Ann: We don't know because we went their last and left their first. We didn't know what happened before and after we were there.

Attorney: When was the next time you would have to see him?

Ann: It was supposed to be 3 consecutive wednesdays in the barangay hall but he told Jumalon ahead of time that he wont be able to show up for the hearing. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday, he finally showed up infront of the barangay councilor and asked for the side of the both parties but he changed his statement claiming that ryam CLIMBED OVER THE FENCE and INTO THEIR HOUSE.

Attorney: Ok, what did Castillion say?

Ann: The councilor told us that Castillion wants reconciliation and offered we could just settle it. But ryam told the councilor that we are pushing through the case. The councilor then told us that he would schedule another session and maybe ryam will then be cool-headed and change his decision.

Attorney: Ok, what happened next?

Ann: When we were about to leave the station, the councilor who was trying to settle the case HASTILY approached us and asked us if we had any expenses about the case and how much was it including the medicines because he was willing to pay us everything. My aunt answered him that we didn't need any money and we were after justice for our brother.

Attorney: Are you planning to get paid?

Ann: No sir, we are willing to push through the case.

Attorney: Good answer. Let me tell you this, the way I see it, this guy has 4 cases already. Article 100 of the revised penal code says "all persons criminally liable shall be civilly liable". That means, do not receive any payment since at the end, they are still going to pay. So what you do, you think of any amount that you want and the justice will decide how much is the right amount to be paid to you. That is his discretion. This includes everything including moral, actual and exemplary damages which apply specifically to this bastard police man.

Attorney: The next hearing, Michael turner and myself will accompany you. But you must understand, lawyers are not allowed in the barangay so we'll only be there to give moral support. So the next time you are getting an offer that seems you have no choice of resisting, which will most likely happen, just tell them you need to go outside to talk to your mom and ill be beside your mom to assist you through the process. If you get offered 100k, don't take it, this case costs way more than that. Ok? So in the next hearing, tell the councilor that you are not willing to settle or go for the "LUPON" because we are taking this case to the courts the next day. The crime he has committed is Grave Threats coupled with a Condition to Kill the penalty for this one is frustrated

murder which is one degree lower than murder and the appropriate penalty for frustrated murder is 12 years and one day to 20 years imprisonment. We will not go through the "LUPON" because cases tackled there are those that have penalty of 4 years or less imprisonment. This is where you made your mistake because you did not consult a lawyer beforehand. You should have complained to the fiscal first and your complaint should have been Grave threats with a condition to kill which was what he did. As a rule, threats are always one degree lower than the act used to threaten someone. As with this case, the equivalent crime is frustrated murder which is 12 years and one day to 20 years imprisonment.

So, what we do now so that the barangay will not be insulted, we are going to attend the next session at the specified time and since we ought not to settle this one in the barangay level, they will usually make a certificate to refer this one to the Lupon. With this action of the barangay anticipated, you have to say no to the offer and tell them that according to your lawyer you are to complain tomorrow at the city hall and that the case is grave threats coupled with a condition to kill and therefore doesn't need a certificate for referral to the Lupon. And of course you have to thank them for their time and all the necessary courtesy that they deserve to avoid future conflicts.

Ann: Attorney, we are afraid about the case that Castillion will be filing against my brother he told us he will file a "peeping tom" case.

Attorney: Don't worry about that, the case would fall as unjust vexation and I will show this one to Michael Turner that the maximum penalty would only fine of 500 pesos without imprisonment and without warrant since peeping tom is not a crime.

Michael Turner: He shouldn't even be arrested right?

Attorney: 4 cases now. This is what happened, Castillion came back for ryan a couple of days after and this time at his house, pointed a gun at him and that constitutes grave threats and on another occasion, in the barangay level, he was threatened again.

Michael Turner: Was he taken to the barangay?

Attorney: No, when he went to the barangay to blotter and file the case after the second incident, when they went there at 9:30am, Castillion was already there, and when they left, Castillion was still there too.

Micheal Turner: Did he threaten him again when he was there? How many witnesses were there? My concern is, about the witnesses, and we have a lot of them right?

Attorney: What im trying to say here is that, they were offered money.

Michael Turner: And they refused. Right?

Attorney: They were going for justice.

Michael Turner: That's right.

Attorney: Anyway, they don't have to get paid because article 100 of the revised penal code and it says all persons criminally liable shall be civilly liable and this includes sleepless nights, mental anguish, the actual expenses for this case and exemplary damages.

Michael Turner: Ok.

Attorney: Now, they are supposed to go to the barangay on Wednesday, and I told them they should go and Castillion will be there to make efforts to compromise, and they will have to tell the councilor they won't settle for any amicable settlement and after this, the barangay councilor would say they will refer this one to the lupon and make a certificate but the family has to say no because we will be complaining the next day after at the city hall.

Michael Turner: So were all going to be there on Wednesday?

Attorney: Yes, and you have to pay me for my support to be there because the barangay officials and and the police might coerce ryam to do something we don't want him to. The family doesn't have moral support, they have no legal support as ryam has only finished grade 5.

Ann: Sir, I want to report something that has been scaring me, its about our neighbor who's the nephew of Castillion and he told us that were fighting against an opponent that we cant handle. He said Castillion's father is a general and we are all going to pay.

Attorney: Don't be afraid. His father is not a general, just a captain. Don't be afraid with this one.

Michael Turner: What happens if he doesn't show up?

Attorney: What were going there for is for courtesy for the barangay officials and for support of this lowly and poor people. If we will not show up in the barangay, the next time ryam or anyone from the family goes to the barangay to complain about something, they might ignore them because they will bring back this issue of them disregarding the authority of the barangay.

Michael Turner: How safe are they?

Attorney: Oh theyre safe.

Michael Turner: Can we tell Bombo radio about this? Or maybe write about it on my blog?

Attorney: Yes, because they will tell the whole community to rise up that the next time Castillion will come and harass ryam and condemn Castillion for the abusive acts. If Castillion will ever come back to harass ryam, the neighbors would text bombo radio and they will come to cover the abuse.

Michael Turner: What do we have to do to have this case covered on Bombo?

Marissa: Im going there to take your case and show it to them because Micheal Bustamante wants a copy of the documents just to support our case for evidence.

Ryam: Sir, I was also told by Castillion that he better not see my face in Barra, Opol because he will shoot me if he will see my face again.

Attorney: Don't worry about that, that's part of his tactics and his threats.

Ann: Castillion also asked if we have a father and we told him we don't have one and maybe that's why he's very aggressive because there's no one to fight him.

Attorney: So, lets not discuss the next step we are going to take. So marissa, thats for you to answer. What are you going to do about the Bombo Radio again?

Marissa: Im going to give these documents to Micheal Bustamante of Bombo Radio to support the the case of Micheal by these evidence to really turn down Castillion.

Attorney: Ok the best thing we have to do now is to gather all the documents that pertains to the Castillion Vs Michael Turner and Castillion vs Ryam and set a meeting between me, Michael turner and Michael Bustamante and we'll plan to make up for the tight schedules of MT,MB and mine. Ok? That is in regards to Bombo Radyo's protection. Lets use the media to protect him.

Michael Turner: How long will it take until the media can protect him?

Attorney: If we can meet MB here tomorrow night and we could agree on the schedule, whatever will our plans be, we can get him to execute all the affidavit of complaints for all the grave threats and everything with the witnesses.

Michael Turner: We need a complete list of witnesses because we don't want people to back out later.

Attorney: Yes, I will tell you. After tomorrow, we could probably agree that by Thursday or Friday, where able to line up all the witnesses in my law office and we'll allocate half a day just to gather all the statements of the witnesses and have them to swear before the prosecutor of the crime for the filing of the cases and were done. Then will give all the affidavit and IS numbers of complaints to MB then he can continue to "bomba" Castillion including all the complaints together.

Michael Turner: And then, they filed a complaint on the ombudsman in davao.

Attorney: Let me continue before we get there.

Michael Turner: ok.

Attorney: In the Philippines, we have this what we call allowance for good conduct, it means that because you filed these cases against Castillion, he will put up a bail band and that whatever happens to you, Castillion will be the first person the judge will call because in his eyes, hes your only enemy. That's under the revised penal code. You have nothing to fear.

So, in short, this is the plan, we'll bring MB here tomorrow night and discuss with him how we can move on with the case, and most probably, by Wednesday, it will still be silent until in the afternoon.

Michael Turner: No talk about it once every three hours?

Attorney: We'll discuss that by tomorrow. I have a lot of friends in Bombo across different time slots.

Attorney: (talking to ryan) This is so you will not be afraid because whatever happens to you, the law will point to no one but to Castillion because you have no enemies whatsoever. And the neighborhood will be called upon to act against him.

Just don't be afraid because you have nothing to pay me for, Im doing this to help you out because this is a very abusive man. He's a PNPA gradual and might become a general later on and what we have to do is to stop this guy from reaching his goals now that he still has a low rank. His father is not a general, just a captain. I know him because we handled 8 cases against him.

Ann: Sir, our witnesses are afraid because when the media coverage came, it was put live on DXCC and someone tipped them that Castillion might turn to them and threaten their lives so that's the reason they are very afraid.

Attorney: Ok, don't worry, what we do is we are going to call all the witnesses here in CDO and we'll make an affidavit since the media is protecting them to and so will I.

They will be well compensated for their effort of testifying and well give them 100 pesos each, well pay for their fares and their lunch as well. They will only be afraid if there will be no lawyer to guide them through.

Michael Turner: What about the case to be sent to the Ombudsman?

Attorney: Micheal, I will find the strongest case against him and file the case at ombudsman because the Police will protect their fellow officers. I will personally file a formal complaint for three more cases and these are very strong cases.

Ann: Attorney, Castillion even made a pseudo name for himself and used a "victor" as his name.

Attorney: Don't worry, he cant do that because we have several cases against him.

So, we will file a complaint at the city prosecutor's office with this criminal case.

Michael Turner: How will you get him suspended?

Attorney: The ombudsman will suspend him. And another thing, were going to write a petition and all the committee will write a letter to the president of the republic to suspend him and then we'll send a copy of the letter to bombo radio and they will read it so the people will know. Ryam will get justice and justice will be good.

Michael Turner: Amen

Attorney: One last thing, do not do anything, do not sign anything without me present. If some 5 policemen will force you and tell you I already agreed, don't sign it. I will continue to represent you without you having to pay me anything but you just have to obey this condition.
